

Reaching Women at Risk for HIV/AIDS



An innovative Enduring activity is now available on the UMDNJ-CCOE website. This webcast of three CME/CE certified activities has been developed to provide analysis of practice barriers that have delayed the implementation of universal HIV testing of women in primary care and prenatal services. Three clinicians who treat women with HIV/AIDS offer perspectives on how to identify, assess, and engage women in HIV treatment.

They examine the epidemiology of women with HIV/AIDS, patterns that correlate with increased risk of infection, and interventions to increase screening and effective risk reduction interventions.

[Optimizing Health and Quality of Life for Women at Risk for HIV/AIDS](#) is a three-part webcast based on the content presented at events held at the three UMDNJ medical schools during the fall of 2010. Each activity is separately certified for continuing education credit/contact hours.



Moving Forward with a Quality Improvement Model for Addressing Tobacco in Behavioral Health Settings



The UMDNJ-Robert Wood Johnson Medical School, Department of Psychiatry, Division of Addiction Psychiatry presents a 3-part series entitled *A Comprehensive Model for Mental Health Tobacco Recovery in New Jersey*. The first two sessions presented on April 7 and June 6, were a success! The final session entitled [A Comprehensive Model for Mental Health Tobacco Recovery in New Jersey: Policy Development and Strategies for Changing Health Systems to Incorporate Tobacco Treatments](#) is now scheduled for November 9, 2011.

Despite the high prevalence of tobacco use, disproportionate tobacco consumption, and excess morbidity and mortality, smokers with mental illness have reduced access to tobacco dependence treatment across the health care spectrum. Peer services that offer support to smokers are essential. This cessation initiative addresses two core goals:

- To increase demand for tobacco cessation services for mentally ill smokers, and
- To help more smokers with mental illness to quit.

Each session has been pilot tested for feasibility and/or effectiveness and revised with feedback from stakeholders. In this way, the implementation of this model has brought together academics, clinicians, administrators and mental health consumers to develop tobacco programming and policy that has been tested in a real world environment and serves as a model for other states.

Each part of the training activity series stands alone, but there is added value in attending more than one. This activity has a registration fee \$100.00. A discounted registration fee of \$30.00 is available to peer specialists accompanying a registered clinical/administrative team member. Organizations are eligible for a maximum of 2 discounted registrations only, per course. Physicians will earn up to 6.5 *AMA PRA Category 1 Credits*[™]. It will also offer contact hours for certified counselors, nurses, psychologists, social workers, and Certified Addiction and Drug Counselors.
