Women of all ages are diagnosed with HIV infection, making up approximately 26% of the epidemic in the United States, with a disproportionate 65% who are African American. This conference will introduce the latest strategies to reduce perinatal HIV transmission. This program is designed to enhance Physicians, Physician Assistants, Advanced Practice Nurses, Nurses, Social Workers (Intermediate Level) and other healthcare providers' competence related to HIV rapid testing, perinatal HIV transmission prevention, legal and ethical issues in perinatal HIV.
